Swimming outcomes 22/23

77.7% pupils were able to meet the KS2 swimming standards. Of these 60% of those attending as “top up” swimming achieved the KS2 swimming standards.

*KS2 swimming standards

- swim competently, confidently, and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres

- use a range of strokes effectively (for example front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke)
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations
