Free School Meals – Important Information for All Families

On the 4th June we emailed an important letter about changes to income-related Free School Meals, these will take effect from 1st September 2026.

Please take a few minutes to read this, even if your child does not currently receive Free School Meals, as it may still apply to you.

If you're not sure whether you are eligible, we encourage you to apply and Suffolk County Council will check this for you.

These changes will also affect the extra funding the school receives (Pupil Premium), as not all children who qualify for Free School Meals will be included in this.
