

Maths

This term, starting with place value, we look at how this helps us to develop our understanding of the four major operations (addition, subtraction, division and multiplication). We will be using a range of equipment and pictorial examples in order to develop depth of understanding in maths.

P.E.

During the autumn term, PE will on Tuesday afternoons. This half term, we will be learning tag rugby and basketball skills, then next half term we will be have cross-country running as well as dance.

Art

In art, we will be focusing on developing our sketching skills. Taking inspiration from portrait artist, Egon Schiele. We will be looking at how we can capture personality as well as improving our drawing skills.

D&T

We will be putting our understanding of textiles and our sewing skills to the test by creating a cushion.

Science

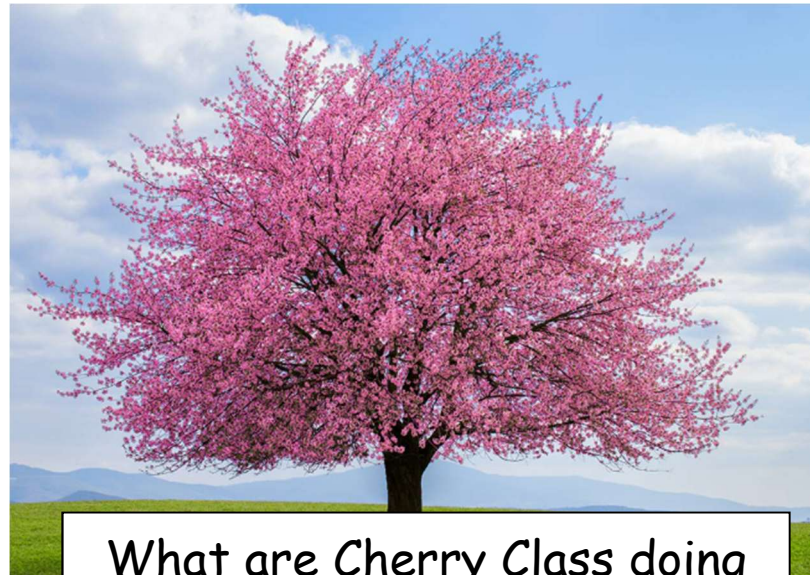
This term, we will be looking at human and animal skeletons as well as nutrition and diet. Through each unit we will be developing our understanding of how to carry out fair tests as well as designing our own simple experiments to test our ideas.

English

This term, we will continue to practise and develop our writing skills through the context of setting descriptions, adventure stories, explanation text as well as instruction writing. Throughout each unit, children will work to develop their understanding of the key features and structures of each type of text, as well as developing their vocabulary, grammar and spelling skills through our Talk 4 Writing approach.

ICT

We will be looking at 'self-image' through our E-Safety unit, as well as how to edit photos and audio using online programmes.

History

For the autumn term, we will be learning more about life in Stone Age Briton. Through this unit we will be finding out how archaeologists make judgements about the past by using primary and secondary sources.

Music

This year, music lessons will be on Wednesdays. We are once again welcoming in the music service to teach them how to play their **new** instruments. They will also be learning how to read sheet music as well as develop a deeper understanding of a range of different types of instruments.
