

Pupil Premium Statement 2017/18

Principles:

- Ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils
- Ensure that appropriate provision is made for vulnerable groups, including those from socially disadvantaged groups
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged groups, we recognise that pupils who receive free school meals are likely to be socially disadvantaged
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered for free school meals and we reserve the right to allocate Pupil Premium funding to include any pupil or group the school has legitimately identified as socially disadvantaged
- We aim to ensure that Pupil Premium funding is used to accelerate progress, moving children into at least age related expectations
- Pupil premium funding will be used to target children to achieve age expectations in particular at the end of KS1 and KS2 and to support those PPG children who are able to achieve at greater depth/higher level.
- Ensure that pupils eligible for PPG are not disadvantaged in terms of access to enhanced curriculum and enrichment opportunities at school
- Ensure that PPG eligible children have the equipment and uniform they need in order to access the curriculum and feel a part of school life

Impact of applying these principles in 2016/17:

Due to the very low number of PPG or disadvantaged children in any cohort (often only one or two), it would be inappropriate to publish statistical analysis in any depth as this is likely to identify individual children within the community. The following gives a picture of our KS2 progress for PPG children compared to non-disadvantaged both within school and nationally;

Achieving expected standards in reading, writing and maths is considered a good measure to promote future social mobility.

Reading, writing and maths combined	75	67	25	11

Children considered disadvantaged made good progress when compared to the National picture across reading, writing and maths. The percentage attaining age related outcomes and higher level outcomes exceeded that nationally achieved. It should be noted that the small numbers of children eligible for PPG mean that the statistical significance of this is difficult to ascertain.
