

**Music** - We will listen to a range of music and understand its history, read simple notation and look and **rhythm and layering**. This will lead onto simple compositions of our own with simple non-tuned instruments.

**Science - Rocks and Soils:** through observation and investigation we will learn about different types of rock, what they are and where they came from, how they change over time, permeability, fossils and the origin of soil and the importance of soil health.

**P.E.** This is delivered by the High School as usual and will be taught on a Monday and Tuesday.

**English**  
After a long gap in school, we will revise some of the basics reminding ourselves of punctuation and sentence structure, working in the context of a recount. We will look at how to use conjunctions to create longer sentences, and adverbial phrases to open sentences giving cohesion to the text.  
We will then look at information texts, narratives with familiar settings and letters building up other aspects of grammar, punctuation and layout.

**ICT** - Gaining an understanding of the internet, we will look at the capabilities this provides and how to stay safe on-line.

**PSHE - All About Me:** we will look at what makes us happy or unhappy: giving to others, having purpose and goals, accepting who we are and appreciating what we have all play a key role. Later in the term, we will consider resilience and how we can build our confidence by trying new things and how we work through challenges.

**Art** – Connecting with Stone Age history topic, why do humans want to express themselves through painting. Looking at cave paintings will be a springboard to explore and develop our own artwork.  
**D&T** – We will be looking at the source of food and how it becomes ready for us to eat; seasonality; and how to prepare a range of dishes. This will all be in the context of looking at a healthy and varied diet.

**History** - This half term we are looking at how did the lives of ancient Britons changed during the Stone Age. How were their lives different to ours and what do we really know about them? What can evidence tell us and just as importantly, what don't we know for sure?

**Maths** - We will start the year with **number and place value:** this will include negative numbers, understanding number up to 1000 for Year 3s and over 1000 for Year 4s, rounding, estimating and writing numbers in numerals and words. We will then move onto calculation starting with addition and subtraction. Problem solving and reasoning will be incorporated throughout the term.

**Geography** – By focusing on aspects of leisure and tourism in Florida, we will gain understanding of people's interaction with the environment and how the climate and location impacts on what is happening to nature, weather and human endeavours.

**R.E.**  
The focus will be beliefs and questions looking at inspirational people including from within the context of Christianity. What can we learn from these people?

**French** – This will be taught by the High School as usual teaching speaking, listening and writing basic phrases.
