Early Reading

Reading remains the gateway to learning for your child/ren. When hearing your child read their school book, please encourage them to use their phonics to sound out unknown words, then help them once they have had a go. The understanding of text is also as important as the ability to read it. Try asking your child/ren to tell you what is happening or to predict what might happen next when they read to you.
